



We have been researching those commemorated at Roundhay St John Church who died serving in World War One and recently published some history of just twelve of the sixty-one listed on the web page at www.oakwoodchurch.info/roundhaystjohn.htm.

These names were submitted to **Tower of London Remembers** by Pete Oldfield. Each day at sunset, starting at 4:55pm, a list of 180 names was read from the Tower Moat, which was filled with 888,246 ceramic poppies each representing a British Military fatality www.poppies.hrp.org.uk/about-the-installation. Names were read in the order they were submitted and validated www.rollofhonour.tumblr.com.
